This day came J. R. Jones et al a majority of a Jury of seven herebefore appointed by this Court to view and mark out a new public road being the Columbiana Road at the School House in the New old field, by J. R. Jones to the road near the swamp running North East from Clanton and present this report in writing stating that they have viewed and marked out said road as follows, Leaving the Columbiana Road at the said School House in the New old field, and running thence to the top of Hayes Mountain th intersecting the Monteville road at the South end of the Gillis old field and running near the middle of sections 24-25 and 36 in T 77 R 14, and intersecting near the swamp the road running North East from Clanton. It is therefore ordered by the Court that said Road as marked out be and the same is hereby established a third grade road. It is further ordered that Geo. Forley be and he is appointed surveyor of the first precinct from the swamp North of Clanton to the Gillis old field. And that Isaac Littleton be appointed surveyor of the second precinct from Monteville road at J. R. Jones to Columbiana road. It is further ordered that the Columbiana Road from the School house in New old field to Logan place and Monteville road from Gillis old field to Logan place

and the Monteville road from Logan place to Baptist Church at Clanton and ~~the road from~~ ~~from Jones to Monteville~~ and the Kingston road from fork at Mrs Dupes to County line be and the same are hereby discontinued.

This day came J. H. Mullins John H. Nelson and M. D. Pierson a committee herebefore appointed by this Court to let out and contract for the repairing of the bridge across the ~~Clanton~~ Creek at Jacksons Mill and present this report in writing as follows

The State of Alabama by the Court of County Commissioners Butler County by the Court of County Commissioners of Butler County to let out and contract for the repairing the bridge across Clanton Creek at Nelsons Mills hereby report the work completed according to contract that we have examined the bridge and find it in good order and therefor recommend that the Court pass an order to pay the Contractor M. B. Smith \$29900 which is the amount of his bid to do said work all of which is respectfully submitted this Dec 6th 1873

It is thereupon ordered by the Court that the said work should be allowed Mrs Dupes 2000⁰⁰ and Monteville

And now comes David L. Kiley and presents his petition to the Court his petition in writing praying that a ferry be established across the Coosa River at the Johnsons old ferry, alleging among other things that he is the owner of the Land on the West side of said River and that there is no other ferry within two miles of said Johnsons old ferry. And it appearing to the satisfaction of the Court that the allegations in said petition are true. It is therefore ordered by the Court that the said D. L. Kiley may establish said ferry across said River at the Johnsons old Ferry upon entering into bond with good security approved by the Judge of Probate of this County, and payable to the County of Carter in the sum of Five Hundred Dollars, and conditioned according to Law. And the said D. L. Kiley having filed with the Judge of Probate of said County his bond with J. W. Patrick and E. Compton as his sureties in the sum of five hundred dollars and conditioned according to law, which bond is deemed good and sufficient. It is therefore ordered that said ferry be and the same be and is established. It is further ordered that said D. L. Kiley be allowed to charge the following rates of passage to wit 4 horse team \$1.00 2 horse team 50 cents 1 horse team or man & horse 25 cents man or woman 10 cents, and he shall be allowed to charge double rates in times of high water.
