18 Dec. 1881

6 July 1882

Verbena To Have An Academy ... On last Sat. a meeting of prominent citizens was had at Verbena for the purpose of considering the question of building an Academy. About \$1,750 was subscribed and a suitable building will be erected at once. This is a move in the right direction, and we are only surprised that it has not been undertaken before. It is indeed gratifying to note such evidences of improvements in the county, and especially so in this case, where the cause of education is to be benefited thereby. The Academy vill be ready to begin its first session Yin Oct. and we doubt not that it will be a splendid institution of it s kind.

2 March 1905
