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COUNTY HISTORY CONTINUED...

The remainder of the county history which was published in the Chilton County News of May 31, 1928 is included and concluded herewith.

The act of establishment named Reuben Powell, Anderson Baker William Vines, E. Ward and John Pernell as commisioners to hold an election, locate a county seat, build a court house and jail, and levy a tax to pay for these evidences of civilization and government. The first county seat of Chilton County was at Grantville, about four miles east of the present court house at Clanton. The old building was made of logs. It had but one room, about 16 x 20 feet. There must have been a jail, also, though no mention is made of such in any of the records so far discovered. The county's first officers were Mordecai Roberson, probate judge, and Thomas H. Williams, sheriff. Both were commissioned in 1869.

The town of Clanton was laid out in 1872 and was named for the Confederate General James Holt Clanton, a native of Georgia and long a prominent figure in political life of Alabama. A more imposing courthouse was built of lumber at the new county seat and served its purpose until it was burned in 1919. The South and North railroad which later became the Louisville and Nashville, reached the point where Clanton now stands in 1870, and later connected Montgomery and Birmingham. Clanton and Birmingham are practically the same age.

The Southern Railway crosses the western part of the county, giving transportation to the markets of Birmingham and Selma. A branch of the Mobile & Ohio railroad crosses the Southern at Maplesville. The pure air and a moderate summer climate is due in part to the high elevation of the greater part of Chilton county. North of Clanton about 6 1/2 miles, is an elevation arising about 830 feet above sea level, known as Jemison Mountain. Near that point is said to be the highest elevation of the L.& N. railroad south of the Tennessee river. The county is shown by Government survey to have an average elevation of about 500 feet.

Lock 12, on the Coosa river about 12 miles from Clanton, was one of the first of the giant hydro-electrical power plants completed in Alabama by the Alabama Power Company. Some years later Mitchell dam was completed further south. The Power company is by far the largest tax payer in the county by reason of these plants and other improvements and a good part of the prosperity and development of the county within recent years is due to expenditures made for constuction and other purposes by the big corporation.

Strawberries, poultry raising and diversified farming have also contributed to improve the income and general prosperity of this section, though cotton remains the chief money crop. The county produced and shipped about 20,000 bales of the staple in 1926 and almost as many with a shorter crop the following year. Indications are favorable to a large acreage in cotton for the present year. The strawberry crop was valued at \$58,000 for the year 1926. Shipments start annually about one week later from Castleberry, and the berries are of fine flavor, color, and shipping qualities. There are numerous large poultry farms in the county and this industry is growing rapidly both in volume and in the quality of birds produced. The wealth annually produced from this source would be difficult to calculate, but it is sufficient to form an important item of local prosperity and the money from the industry is widely distributed."

LAST MEETING By Marian Mims

The July meeting of the Chilton County Historical Society was held at Shoney's Restaurant in Clanton. After the regular business meeting a special program on Camp Watts, Alabama was given by Ben Roberts. We were introduced to the existence of the Camp Watts Association promoting recognition adn commemoration of the men and women that served and/or died at Camp Watts. The installation was a Confederate Camp of Instruction and Conscription located just outside of Notasulga, Ala, during the Civil War. The Camp was burned to the ground by Union troops under Gen. Rousseau (except for the hospital) in 1864. The Association is attempting to have the site placed on the State and National Historical Registers. We were assured that there would be updates forthcoming.

CEMETERIES OF CHILTON

Being mailed with this issue of the Newsletter is a listing of burials at New Mars Hill which dropped by the wayside when this census was published. The pages have been numbered in keeping with their originally intended sequencing and sized to fit easily into place. Naturally these names are also omitted from the index. An updte of the

index is not being provided due to the inordinate amount of effort and cost involved. This missing information is being provided to all owners of the book at no cost to them; we extend our sincere apology for the unfortunate mishap and hope that the additional listing will make up for the oversight. While we regret such an incident we are extremely happy that we were able to find it. A number of unmarked burials have been identified recently and it is contemplated that a supplement, with a corrected index, could be published in the not too distant future. The unmarked burials found thus far are surfacing from the obituary index currently being provided in this publication, for the most part.
