He died 9 January 1843 and is buried in the Old Rasberry Cemetery at Isabella, Alabama. Also need the surname of his wife Mary Ann who died 24 November 1855. Does anyone know where daughter Emelia, who married Shuler Green, is buried?

First need is for the parents and siblings of Henry Hilliard Horn (Horne). This man was born 3 February 1809 in Halifax County, North Carolina and died 30 January 1870 in Columbia County, Arkansas; his wife (of three), Lethia Ann Coleman, born 28 November 1813 in the Carolinas or Georgia, and who died 9 July 1835 in Autauga County, Alabama. She was the daughter of Thomas Coleman (1787-1865) and his wife Martha _____ (c1790-1848). Henry H. Horn lived in Autauga County, Al. during the years 1831-1842. Their two sons, Benjamin F. (1831-1862) and Aolpheus M. (1833-1869) were both born in Autauga County. The wife Lethia Coleman Horn was buried in an Autauga

County cemtery when she died. The second need is her burial place and the date and place of this couple's marriage.

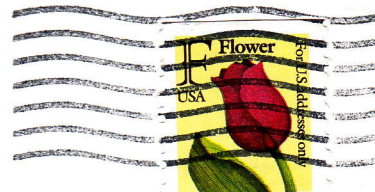

Biographical sketch of Mary Elizabeth LaMont Richardson by Sanders H. LaMon.

Mary was born February 2, 1937, in Atlanta, Georgia. She was named for her paternal grandmother, her aunt (Mrs. Phillip Gill, later of Jemison), and several other ancestors who shared the name. Her father was Louis Ernest LaMont, a native of Montgomery, Alabama. His mother's family (Barry) had come to Alabama from Knoxville, Tennessee, in the early 1800's, migrating to Lowndes county, near Hayneville. His father had also migrated to Lowndes county, as a printer, in the 1870's, from Michigan. For a brief time he was general manager of the Geneva newspaper. Mary's paternal grandparents met because most of the men in the family were printers, before and after the Civil War, and her grandmother had been trained as a printer, while a teenaged girl, by her father who was then foreman of the Montgomery Advertiser, due to the shortage of men workers after the war. Her maternal grandparents were Stricklands from North Georgia, near Dawsonville, and Arringtons from Anderson, South Carolina. Grandfather Strickland was an engineer, a graduate of Georgia Tech and a member of the Georgia Tech football team of 1899. Her mother, Dorothy Strickland LaMont, was born in South Carolina and raised there and in North Georgia. She graduated from nursing school in Atlanta, about 1930, and still lives there in retirement after almost 50 years as a nurse and public health worker. Mary's father was born in 1892 at the family home on Clayton Street in Montgomery and attended the old Boys High School and Auburn University. During World War One he enlisted in the Quartermaster Corps, but was called back to Montgomery and named adjutant general, a title that at the time meant he was the chief executive of the draft board in the State. The two, Louis LaMont and Dorothy Strickland, were married in Atlanta in 1932, during the "great depression". When Mary was born in 1937 her mother was working as a nurse and her father for an insurance company; her grandmother Barry lived with them at that time. Her brother, Sanders Hickey LaMont, was born in 1940 and is now a newspaper editor in Modesto, California. Mary started public school in Atlanta and moved with the family to Mobile, Alabama during World War Two when her mother took a job at the old Marine Hospital (converted to a welfare clinic). Her father traveled throughout those years, conducting audits of workmen's compensation records all over the South. She attended the Leinkauf Elementary School and then graduated from Murphy High School in 1955. In school she was a better than average student, willing to occasionally skip class on a warm spring day to travel to Gulf Shores to the beach. She was active in her high school sorority, was a cheerleader and a member

of the Homecoming Court. She frequently was invited to dances at Christmas time or traveled to Marion Military Institute for the formal dances held there. After high school graduation she moved to Coral Gables, Florida, for a brief time, where her father was living but in poor health. She worked in a clothing store and helped him while she attended the University of Miami for one year. While she enjoyed the school, and the beaches, she dropped out of her sorority because it refused to admit a Jewish girl to membership. In 1956 Mary moved to Montgomery, with her father who had retired due to ill health, and worked for Liberty Mutual Insurance Company. Her father died in the early part of 1957. That same year she met and married Roy Arnold-Richardson on that day in August that he graduated from Auburn University. Thus began Mary's life-long devotion to Auburn and its sports teams. Mr. and Mrs. Richardson lived first in an apartment in Bessemer, then bought a home in Birmingham where he worked for the telephone company. Their first child, son Ben, was born and adopted in 1965. Three years later they adopted a daughter, Beth and the Richardson family seemed complete.



Subsequently, the family moved several times and lived for short terms in Decatur and Anniston. Phillip, their second son, was born to them in a bit of a surprise in 1970 while Roy, with his family, was on a temporary assignment in New Jersey. Upon returning to Alabama the following year, they bought eighty acres of land and a new house in the country just outside of Jemison, Alabama. Through the next 15 years, while her husband commuted to his job in Birmingham, Mary ran the home, raised cows, gardened extensively, joined a quilting club and became active in everything from the PTA to the Alabama Cattlemen's Association. Mary was a staunch supporter of the Jemison Library where her son, Ben, practically grew up. She joined and supported Saint Andrews Episcopal Church in Montevallo where she served on the vestry of that church. All three of the Richardson children

graduated from Jemison High School. Her daughter, Beth, is currently an engineering student at Auburn University due to graduate in the near future. Ben, her first son, is employed and living in Montevallo and her second son, Phillip, is a student at the University of North Alabama at Florence. After a divorce in the 1980's, Mary went to work outside of the home for the first time in several years. She tried truck farming, raising cows, selling crafts, quilted pillows in particular and found that the insubstantial financial returns did not compensate for the time away from home and family. She applied to the E.L. Kliner Furniture company to fill an opening there and was hired as manager, a position she held to her untimely death. Her duties were manifold and included furniture sales, merchandise purchases at regional marts and help in opening other branches of the Klenco outlets. With her many business contacts and involvement in community activities she made many new friends just as she had in her church activities in Montevallo and a women's communion group in Chilton County. One of the many friends she made was a young Chilton County soldier that accompanied his mother who shopped at the furniture store. Later this young man participated in Operation Desert Storm and Mary happily corresponded with him during that time; she encouraged him and told him of her prayers for him. A possession she gladly displayed on her refrigerator was a letter from the young GI, thanking her for being his friend and writing to him. This particular letter stated that "you are one of the first people I want to see when I get home!" In May of this year she sold the farm and moved from Chilton County to Montevallo. With Beth and Phillip in college, she and Ben were eager to live in town nearer friends and job opportunities. This move was to own and occupy an historic house on Vine Street that she was determined to restore. Several of the items of furniture in her home had been handed down in her family, including items made on the Barry family place in Lowndes County in the 1840's. Mary was quite excited to finally have an old home with high ceilings and hardwood floors that would allow her to more appropriately utilize these belongings. She had lately begun discussing a career change in hopes of working at Montevallo College (where her grandmother Arrington had graduated in 1900), thereby allowing her to indulge her high interest in working with young people. She had already scheduled herself to take a computer course in the Fall term. Proud of her children, challenged by and happy with her new home, she was full of plans and goals for the future for self and family. Alas, Mary LaMont Richardson died on Wednesday, June 5th, 1991 in the normal course of her duties at E.L. Kliner Furniture Company. She is buried in the Barry-LaMont family plot at Oakwood Cemetery in Montgomery, Alabama, just a few blocks from the State Capitol in one direction, and the Barry family home at 508 Clayton Street, now part of the city's historic district, in the other.

ACKNOWLEDGEMENT

Several of our members have been kind enough to help the editor of this publication with a personal endeavor. They very graciously furnished information about their Confederate Veteran kinspeople. We intend to incorporate their information in a book from which we will receive financial proceeds. Naturally, we intend to give credit to them in the publication for having supplied the need. The listing when complete will contain a com-

prehensive listing of the Confederate soldiers who served from this county and will hopefully show where each of them is buried.

We are providing key parts of the research to the UDC for inclusion in a national database which will allow anyone to find the burial place of any Confederate or Union veteran of the Civil War. However, the identification of these individuals frequently can be obliterated when two men have the same name. Therefore, we are making considerable effort to locate marriage dates and places, burial places, widows names and burial dates, former wives or anything pertinent to all the men whose names are on the list. To date there are just over 900 men (barring duplications) that we have found. Our sources have been newspaper pension lists, local pension applications as well as Alabama pension files, rosters of regiments, records of Betty J. Collins, John David Glasscock, Nell Thomas and my own records. We have benefitted from the Shelby County Historical Society Quarterly, Ellison's and Abram's histories of Bibb County, and many others. All these sources will comprise the bibliography of the book.

Still the intent of this article was to name and recognize some of those from whom we received names and or information about their families. CAMP WATTS

We are proud to announce to our membership that Camp Watts, Alabama has been placed on the State Historical Register as of the 29th of July, 1992. The Civil War camp was designated as a Camp of Instruction And Conscription as well as the site of a General Hospital. Thirty nine of the men buried at the camp have been documented and indications are that there are about sixty-five more burials at the Camp Watts cemetery. Cur-

rently, only one grave marker exists and it marks the burial site of George W. Arnold of Blount County, Alabama who was killed during the fighting around Atlanta in 1864. A memorial tribute for those buried at Camp Watts was held in Notasulga this past July 18th and a repeat ceremony is contemplated for 1993.

This project grows more interesting with every passing minute. The ties which are surfacing through marriages or common military experience are highly enlightening. Numerous folks have submitted names and or units so that our list now numbers about 1190 men. Wedding dates and places have been identified for more than 50% of the men in the list. Units

for about 90% of the men have been found.

Several of the names in the list are so common that it could take years to identify the proper unit for local men such as "Robert Wilson" which applies to about 27 different soldiers from Alabama. In cases like that about all we will be able to do will be to indicate number of units possible.

The search has been multi-faceted in that so many different sources have been consulted. Of those, the old newspapers of Chilton have been one of the most tremendous resources for this activity. Likewise, books written about Bibb, Shelby and Autauga are proving quite helpful. Still, the material submitted by members, or prospective members, and helpers like the indefatigable Nell Thomas and Betty Collins, cannot possibly be properly acknowledged.
